

KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



Eva Zamrazilova, Chairwoman of the Czech Fiscal Council

Eva Zamrazilova is a leading Czech economist who served on the Board of the Czech National Bank between 2008 and 2014. She completed her master's and doctoral studies at the University of Economics, Prague, and began teaching statistics theory and economic statistics there in 1990. Concurrently, as a researcher at the Institute of Forecasting

at the same university, she participated in many studies on the transformation of the Czech economy. She also worked at the Economic Institute of the Czechoslovak Academy of Sciences and the Research Institute of Labour and Social Affairs. Since 1994, she worked at Komerční banka on its Macroeconomic Analysis and Forecasting team. In February 2008, the President of the Czech Republic appointed her to the Board of the Czech National Bank; she took office on 1 March 2008. After concluding her six-year mandate, she became the Chief Economist of the Czech Banking Association in 2014. Four years later, in January 2018, she was appointed Chairwoman of the Czech Fiscal Council. She continues to lecture macroeconomic analysis at the University of Economics, Prague. Eva Zamrazilova's first-term mandate at the Czech Fiscal Council is for six years.



Jack Hou, Professor of Economics at California State University, Long Beach

Jack W. Hou is Professor of Economics at California State University, Long Beach. He received his Ph.D. from Yale University in 1989.

He was President of the Chinese Economists Society (CES) in 2007-08. He was President of the Western Social Science Association (USA) in 2010-11, and also an officer

of the Western Economic Association (USA). He was the senior coeditor of the Contemporary Economic Policy (a publication of the Western Economic Association) till 2010, and was re-appointed as the Specialized Co-Editor of the Contemporary Economic Policy in 2014. He has served as an Associate Editor for Economic Modeling since 2018, and on the editorial board of numerous economic journals.

He has been a visiting professor at Purdue University, Soochow University (Taiwan), and most recently at UCLA. He has been a Research Fellow at the Teaching and Learning Institute (USA), and the China Enterprise Institute (Taiwan).

He is a Visiting Professor at Huazhong University of Science and Technology, University Fellow Professor at Nankai University, Adjunct Chair Professor at Jinan University, among others.

He has been the keynote speaker (either at the opening ceremony or closing ceremony) at various conferences in the U.S., Germany, France, Japan, and China. He has published extensively in referee journals in North America, Europe, and in Asia; and contributed Chapters to many books. His research focuses on the Chinese Economy (Labor, Aging, Trade, and Political Economy), Labor Economics, International Trade/Finance, and Economic History. His most recent interest has shifted to environment, sustainability, and finance.



Florentina Paraschiv, Chair of Finance at the Zeppelin University, Germany

Prof. Dr. Florentina Paraschiv holds a Chair of Finance at the Zeppelin University (Germany) and is further affiliated with the NTNU Business School (Norway) and the University of St. Gallen (Switzerland). She studied International Economic Transactions (diploma) and Banking and Capital Markets (Master's) at Babes-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca. This was followed by a teaching

assistantship at her alma mater, followed by a visiting term at the Institute of Economics at the University of Zurich. She then completed her PhD at the Institute for Operations Research and Computational Finance at the University of St. Gallen. Subsequently, she was awarded an assistant professorship there, at the end of which she successfully earned her post-doctoral qualification. Florentina Paraschiv then moved on to the Faculty of Economics and Management at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU) in Trondheim, where she was initially an Associate Professor and later Professor of Financial Economics and Head of the newly founded NTNU Centre for Banking and Finance. At the same time, she remained associated with the HSG as a lecturer.

Florentina Paraschiv has also been a visiting researcher at the University of Duisburg-Essen, the University of Vienna, the University of Oslo, the London Business School, and the Isaac Newton Institute at the University of Cambridge. Her research results in energy finance have been awarded several times.

Her research and teaching activities cover several areas in Banking and Finance with particular emphasis on Sustainable Finance. She focuses on the strategic implications of sustainability challenges for financial systems. In her on-going research, Paraschiv proposes solutions to respond to financial risks posed by social and sustainability issues, including Environmental, Social, and Governance (ESG) investing.
